**SYLLABUS: DRAWING** 

### • Introduction:

This course introduces students to the practice of free hand drawing and subsequently to apply it in the architectural design process.

The course will introduce drawing as a way of thinking, as a visual perception, as a means for observation, judgment, storytelling and representation. The process of drawing represented as experience, as a relationship between man and the world.

## • Aims and purpose of the course:

This course will help students to strengthen their free hand drawing skills, developing eye, hand and mind coordination, fundamentals of architectural drawing, as well as critical mind experience for learning about architecture.

The course will help the students to learn to observe the world in a new way and to communicate their impressions by drawing.

### • Course Structure:

The structure of the course consists of short lessons, Labs, discussions on classical and contemporary architecture, still life drawing, composition exercises in the studio and outside visits.

There will be numerous organized visits to public places and squares in order to allow students to work outside, experience the space and communicate with reality.

## FORMAT:

<u>Types of Instruction:</u> Lecture, Lab, Homework assignments; Classwork assignments; Textbook readings;

Students work in class on drawing projects with assistance from the instructor.

The students are expected to pursue the study program even out of class, in order to accomplish their tasks more effectively. Different field trips are organized with historical introduction, Drawing activities and Surveying and project exercises.

### **Evaluation and Grading:**

Methods of evaluation: Participation in class and attendance(20%); Homework and Classwork assignment (50%); Monthly examination(30%);

<u>Grade</u>: The grade is determined by the attitude of the student toward his/her work, the desire to increase his/her own knowledge; how the student has matured as seen through a comparison of the work completed during the semester.
